John “Jack” Moseley

John “Jack” Moseley passed away on August 2, 2018 after suffering from Alzheimer’s disease. He was 91 years of age.

Known throughout the industry for company, Moseley Associates, maker of control and wireless audio transport systems.

Moseley was born in Springfield, IL to William and Helen Moseley. After High School, he attended Purdue University. Following two years in the US Army Signal Corps, he moved to Santa Barbara and received a BSEE in electrical engineering and an MS in physics from the University of Southern California. He was a Ham operator, W6ERD.

In 1949, he married his wife Laureen “Laurie” and, after her death in 1979, remarried in 1980 to Kathleen Cameron.

After working for Raytheon, Lear, and D and R Limited, he found Moseley Associates in his garage in 1959. His focus was remote control gear for radio and television, later expanding to RF links from studios to transmitters, FM exciters, stereo and SCA generators, and satellite earth station control systems. Several of his models became standards in the industry, including the [TRC-15A](#) and the [MRC-1600](#), and the PCL-505 and 606 STL systems.

Moseley sold the company in 1979 to Flow-General and retired. Splitting his time between Santa Barbara and Lake City, CO, he became active in philanthropic activities, including the Santa Barbara Cancer Center. Along with golf, Ham operations, and tennis, Moseley especially enjoyed glass blowing, making jewelry, vases, glass beads, etc. He was also a clarinet player in local bands.

Moseley is survived by his son Mark and three grandchildren.
